Curriculum news

When we welcome our students back in September I am delighted to announce some exciting curriculum updates.

Years 7 and 8

This year we are introducing some new enrichment opportunities to our students already full timetables. Along side our core curriculum offer of English, Maths, Science, Humanities, ICT and PSHE all students will have Forest School for two sessions each week. This will be delivered by our new outdoor education practi-



tioner. In addition to this, every Tuesday our students will have Enrichment opportunities on their timetable, this will be on a carousel bases across the year with each student experiencing Textiles, Construction, Catering, Music and Swimming. I think you will agree that this allows our students to experience a wide and varied curriculum.

Year 9

At North Star 240° our students start their Key Stage 4 curriculum in Year 9. As with Years 7 and 8 they follow a traditional core curriculum. In addition to this our Year 9 students will start to follow BTEC accredited courses in Vocational Studies (Construction), Land Based Studies with our new outdoor practitioner and BTEC in Home Cooking (Catering).

Years 10 and 11

Year 10 and 11 in all schools are traditional thought of as the exam years. At North Star 240o in years 10 and 11 students will undertake a number of different accreditations from Entry levels, BTECs and GCSEs. As with Key Stage 3 students will sit English, Maths and Science up to GCSE level, ICT is compulsory for all students which is essential for all students in the modern world. Students get to chose three of the following;

GCSE Music, GCSE Art, GCSE PE. BTEC Land Based Studies, BTEC in Home cooking (Catering), BTEC Vocational Studies. Lastly, students can choose the Duke of Edinburgh award and work up to their Silver award.
