## WHAT HAVE WE DONE IN OUR CLASSES THIS WEEK?

- **7a** We have completed our Science unit on Cell Processes and ended the topic with making life sized skeletons of some brave individuals! We are working in hard in maths on algebra and continue to make good progress. This week in English, we have been creating a business selling pencils and pitching our ideas.
- **8a** This week in English, we have continued working on the Garbage King where we have been writing diary entries based on the main character Mamo. We finished our unit in science on digestion and completed our assessment. In Maths we have now started our new topic of proportion and scale.
- **9A Gemini** Weekly Highlights-We have been firing on all cylinders across the curriculum, diving into explosive topics, poetic reflections, and hands-on creativity! Students explored the dramatic world of volcanoes—how they form, why they erupt, and their impact on people and land-scapes. From lava flows to tectonic plates, it's been a fiery journey of discovery. In science, the class investigated photosynthesis by testing leaves for starch. Armed with iodine and curiosity, they uncovered the hidden chemistry of plant life. Factorising took centre stage in maths, with students breaking down algebraic expressions like pros. Brackets and terms were flying as they mastered this key skill. In English, the class studied William Blake's poignant poem The School Boy, reflecting on themes of freedom and constraint. They drew powerful connections to Mina and Michael from Skellig, exploring how education and imagination shape identity. The kitchen was buzzing as students cooked up delicious lasagna from scratch. Layers of pasta, rich sauce, and cheesy goodness—Bellissimo!
- Maths (KS4) In Maths this week we have been focusing on inverting skills learned last week, beginning to get to grips with factorising linear and quadratic expressions. Special mention to Elijah, Vincent, Hayden, Alfie S, Harry, Riley and Alfie W this week who all did exceptionally well with this week's extension tasks!
- English English Department Highlights: A Week of Creativity and Critical Thinking. 9A & 10B: Blake Meets Skellig-Students in 9A and 10B have been exploring the powerful connections between William Blake's poetry and David Almond's novel Skellig. By analysing The School Boy, they uncovered how Blake's themes of freedom, nature, and the constraints of formal education echo through the characters of Mina and Michael. Thoughtful discussions and written reflections brought these literary links to life.
- 10A Voices from the Streets—In a gritty creative writing challenge, 10A stepped into the world of Stone Cold by Robert Swindells. They imagined new characters who might cross paths with Link on the streets of London, crafting compelling conversations using direct speech and inverted commas. The results were powerful, empathetic, and often chilling—showing a deep understanding of the novel's themes of homelessness and survival.
- **Year 11** have been sharpening their pens with a focus on transactional writing. From crafting formal and informal letters to writing newspaper articles and persuasive essays, they've tackled real-world issues with clarity and conviction. A standout task was their persuasive essays on violence in the media—students debated passionately, using rhetorical devices and structured arguments to make their voices heard.
- **P.E** Our football fitness and skill application goes from strength to strength! In lessons students from years 7-11 are demonstrating excellent passing, dribbling and shooting in practices and game situations. The evidence of this progression has been seen in interschool competition against North Star 180 and Soundwell Academy this week. A 6-2-win v NS180 with goals from Tyreese, Elijah, Tommy, Ruben and OP and a 3 -1 win away v Soundwell with goals from Colbie-Jae (2) and Tommy. We finish winners of the KS3 Bristol, Bath and South Glos SEND schools league, with a record of 3 wins and 1 draw and look forward to playing in the final in December!

Player of the match v NS180 was Tyreese for his all-action midfield display with a goal. Player of the match v Soundwell was Raf for his physical dominance and passing. Special mention to Tommy for scoring one of the best goals we have witnessed here at NS240 - a wonderful curling effort from 25 yards that sailed into the top corner v Soundwell.

**KS3 Pathways to Re-engage**: Big well done to Tianna who has completed a full week and had a good week. All the Reengage students have had a positive week excelling in their favourite subjects, Catering, Construction and Science.
